WHY ELEARNING?

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS OF COUNTRY ARE BECOMING STANDARD PRACTICE IN MANY ORGANISATIONS.

Most people who deliver an Acknowledgement of Country read from a script, ad lib one they've heard elsewhere or, worst case scenario, treat it as a "tick box" part of housekeeping.

Our video eLearning is an effective way to help everyone in your organisation understand why Acknowledgements are practiced, when and where they are used and how to give a meaningful Acknowledgement of Country. Learners will be encouraged to find their personal connection to Country and to get curious about the lands they live, work and play on.

Acknowledgements of Country are a practice of connection. When everyone understands why we do it and how to make it our own, people feel safe to try something new and share a bit about themselves. Through sharing stories and information, we connect on a meaningful level and create a rich shared culture.

Many organisations use this training as part of their onboarding process to set a welcoming and connective tone with new employees. By providing this information on-demand through your LMS, everyone can learn at a time that is convenient for them.

WHAT'S INVOLVED IN ELEARNING

WE HOST OUR VIDEO ELEARNING IN A CONVERSATIONAL
FORMAT TO ENCOURAGE EXPLORATION.

Each section has a short video introduction, summary of key points and a reflection question.

We encourage courageous conversation and recommend hosting a live discussion with participants at regular intervals of the eLearning rollout. This enables people to reflect on their learnings, practice their Acknowledgement and explore further questions. These conversations can be facilitated internally or you can add a facilitated Q&A hosted by Rhys and Emma to your eLearning package.
